

Real example: how I filled the professional liability declarations page

What to notice

Nobody fills in a declarations page; the carrier does. What you do is read it, because every payer credentialing form asks five things from it: carrier, policy number, policy period, the two limits, and the coverage form.

The coverage form line is the one to read twice. Claims-made and occurrence are different products, the tempting reading is whatever the policy was called when you first bought it, and the credentialing team compares your tick to the certificate you attach; a mismatch is a query that costs a week. Answer from the declarations page in force on the day you sign, and reread that page at every renewal so every payer's file matches the current policy.

Payer forms want the two liability limits as numbers. Mine are the common one million per claim and three million aggregate; I have written them in words here only so this example carries no figures at all.

- ☒ A certificate of insurance or the declarations page itself, attached to the application
